National government

National government here refers to the national government office responsible for the work on disaster risk management, urban development, and local governments. It can be the Sendai Framework focal agency, ministries in charge of urban development, climate agenda, Prime Minister's office, or any national government entity with key responsibility to support local governments in strengthening resilience and sustainable development.

National governments are supporting entities of MCR2030 and have a critical role to play in accelerating and institutionalizing local disaster risk reduction and resilience agenda for the country. They will have a special MCR2030 dashboard page to view the country progress and enhance communication with their local governments participating in MCR2030.

<u>Note:</u>

You will need a registration code to join and have a privilege access to a country page. Please contact MCR2030 secretariat in your region to obtain the code before proceeding with the sign-up.



Decide who will create the dashboard account for your organization

- This can be anyone from your organization
- This person will, by default, have the dashboard administrative role for your organization and will be able to add more team members later once the dashboard account is created
- All team members can help to edit the organization's profile, add your services, search for cities and use all other features of the dashboard (See dashboard 'how-to add/manage team' guide for details)

<u>Tips:</u>

If someone from your organization has already signed up, please coordinate with the person to get access to the dashboard. Do not sign up again as this will create a duplicate profile

1. Visit the MCR2030 dashboard at: https://mcr2030dashboard.undrr.org/

<u>Tips:</u>

You can view the MCR2030 dashboard in other language by clicking the language drop down option in the top right-hand corner. More languages will be added.

1. Local governments: Only local governments can participate as cities. For the purposes of the MCR2030, "local government" includes all administrative units which are sub national, such as, but not limited to, cities, municipalities, towns, villages, districts, provinces, states, etc.

2. Participating entities: Any national government entity, national association of municipality, development agency, NGO & CSO, academia and research institution, private sector organization, UN entity or organization, networks or interested entities with specific knowledge and expertise that can support cities to progress along the resilience roadmap are encouraged to join and support local governments in making cities resilient.





<u>Tips:</u>

'National government office' is a special user category created for national government offices in charge of disaster risk management, urban development, local governments, or those with responsibility to support the advancement of local resilience. Select this user type will allow you to access the dashboard with ability to oversee the progress of all local governments in your country. Selecting other type of organization will not lead you to the correct dashboard.



Quick overview: What can national governments do on the dashboard?

- National governments can use the MCR2030 dashboard to oversee the progress of their cities on resilience
- National governments can see how many cities have joined MCR2030 and have access to the dashboard
- National governments can see where on the resilience roadmap their cities are
- National governments can add services and guidance that their cities can use to progress on resilience
- National governments can see which participating entities can provide support to cities in their countries
- National governments can search for services available for their cities by relevant stages, themes, service providers, type of services, etc. and contact the service providers for collaboration
- National governments can view insights and experience shared by their cities
- National governments can search their cities and participating entities and contact them
